
# The Implementation Challenge: Why Asset Management Plans Sit on the Shelf

**Asset management** is about how we work together to make informed decisions about infrastructure, to deliver services sustainably.

It's an ongoing process of assessing, planning, implementing, learning, and adjusting.

It's not a noun, it's a verb.

The **Plan** is the "thing" where you typically document what you know about your services and the assets that deliver them, and what you need to do to get better at asset management.

The **Implementation Challenge** is where you get **stuck** starting or sustaining your efforts to incorporate information and recommendations from your **plan** with the **decisions** you make.

The outcome? Your Plan sits on the shelf, and nothing meaningfully changes in the way you do business.


## Why do we get stuck?

- Silos
- Lack of buy-in
- Lack of leadership
- Not my job
- Not enough time
- Not enough money
- Not enough people
- Not a priority



## Why do we get stuck?

- Weak relationships
- Poor communication
- Don't know what the "goal" is
- Don't know why this matters
- Lack of clear roles
- Lack of focus
- Lack of accountability
- Competition for people, for money
- Fear of change, of conflict, of risk
- Lack of trust

### What's the root cause?

There isn't one! – but some big, inter-related reasons we see:

There's too much emphasis on the *Plan*.

Decision-makers and influencers aren't on board.

Trying to do it all, all at once.

The Team is an afterthought, or not thought of at all.

1. Recognize that asset management is as much a PEOPLE problem as a TECHNICAL problem.

- Developing a vision for asset management. Ground it in sustainable service delivery. This means thinking not just about what you aspire to be or look like as a community but how you aspire to work together to provide service.
- Focus on how you do business, not just the plan.

2. Start from the start.

- Take an organizational asset management maturity assessment like AssetSMART 2.0.
- Set realistic improvement goals and take incremental steps towards them.
- Prioritize.



3. Engage decision-makers.

- Engage senior management and Council from the beginning.
- Have representatives on your team as you develop your Plan.
- Communicate with Council regularly.


4. Pay attention to the team like you never have before.

- Recognize this isn't just a finance, or just an engineering thing.
- Assemble a diverse team to develop the Plan and lead its implementation. Consider distributed leadership.
- Consider not just current roles, but capacities, personalities, and readiness for change.

Embrace the discomfort!



1. Recognize the playbook doesn't win the game itself. People do.





2. As a team, play in your own league. Through regular workouts, practices, and wins, you'll move up the ranks.




3. Make sure the team's owner, GM, coach, and players are all on the same page with what needs to be done.

4. As players and as a team, know your roles, where you're fit and strong, and what skills and muscles you need to develop to elevate your game.




